Simple Past "to be" - Exercices



Exercice 1 - Conjugue « to be » au Simple Past.

1. The children (be) **were** very happy when they (be) **were** on holiday.
2. - (Be-your best friend) **Was your best friend** at school yesterday?
- No, she **wasn't**
3. My parents (not be) **weren't** very happy when they saw my bad results.
I told them the test (be) **was** very difficult but they refused to believe me.
4. I (be) **was** very sad when she told me her father (be) **was** ill.
5. You (be) **were** in the garden and she (be) **was** in the kitchen.
6. (they- not – be) **Weren't they** very tired after running 10 miles?
Of course they **were**
7. That book (be – not) **wasn't** interesting. It (be) **was** boring.
8. (be – she) **Was she** ill last week?
Yes. She (be) **was** feverish and (be) **was** in a lot of pain.
9. - (be – all the students of that school) **Were all the students of that school** on holiday last Friday?
- Yes, they **were**
10. We (be) **were** very frightened when we saw a snake in the garden.

11. Sam's new neighbour (be – not) **wasn't** very kind.
